Dear friends,

It has been an amazing year! Looking back at 2016, Kayla and I think about how much Brave Trails has grown in just one year. We are so honored that we are able to work with the queer leaders of tomorrow. We are continually inspired by what our campers have to offer not only to the Brave Trails community but also to the world at large.

This year has been one of unbelievable growth. We held camp in Wrightwood CA for our second year and we doubled our program from one week to two weeks. We were able to bring camp to 96 campers and we had a waitlist of 67 campers. We also increased our volunteer staff to 30 people that very generously took their vacation from their full-time jobs to join us at camp. We doubled the amount of volunteers that led leadership workshops for our campers. We implemented "Brave Space," a program which is a monthly meetup group for local campers. Brave Space participants got to join in many different activities including cake decorating, museum visits, and a beach party! With our success, we were able to bring on our first paid employee- Kayla was able to work part-time for Brave Trails. We also now have our very own office in Culver City!

We are continuing to grow and are planning for Brave Trails' future. As I mentioned before we had a waitlist of 67 campers, which shows us that there is more need for the safe, leadership-driven space we have created. We plan on offering 3 weeks total of camp next summer, a one-week program, and a two-week program! We plan to double the number of campers to accommodate the waitlist. We are also going to continue to expand and improve Brave Space.

Lastly, we are truly grateful to our supporters and funders. Your generosity made it possible to bring Brave Trails to life. We (and our LGBTQ+ campers) are forever grateful. Please accept our heartfelt thanks for supporting our incredible journey. We look forward to growing together as we expand our mission and vision to empower the next generation of LGBTQ youth leaders and changemakers.

The mission of Brave Trails is transforming LGBTQ youth and families into leaders through summer camp and innovative programming. Brave Trails is more than just your average summer camp. While we have a lot of elements of a typical camp, our main focus is helping our campers grow into the brave leaders they are destined to be. Our program focuses on four key elements: Leadership, Community Building, Self Realization, and Service. We use workshops, adventure and artistic programming, service projects, peer connections, and positive role models to create a safe space where youth can thrive. In addition, our campers will have the knowledge and confidence to be more impactful leaders and implement innovative social change in their communities.

There is not an LGBTQ summer camp anywhere in our target area, which specifically serves LGBTQ youth. Given the current climate of inequality in our world, there is a need to empower the next generation of LGBTQ leaders and give them the tools to continue in the quest for justice and civil rights for all.




